Atmospheric and individual office spaces in Ruoholahti

The historic Tallbergintalo exudes the atmosphere and spirit of the Functionalist era. Its offices provide an excellent working environment.

The historic funky building at Tallberginkatu 2 is best known as Tallbergintalo. Located in Ruoholahti, the building works hand in hand with the adjacent building, Itämerentalo. Both buildings are home to several creative businesses. The two buildings share a lunch restaurant and a lobby service, which is conveniently accessible via an internal passageway. The façade and street-level lobbies of the 1938 funky building were renovated in 2023.





The Functional style arrived in Finland as early as the 1930s, but its practicality has remained in our country to this day.

Tallbergintalo was built in the spirit of the Functionalist period. The style arrived in Finland in the early 1930s and had an immediate impact on Finnish architecture and design. Functionalist houses are characterised by their box-like, horizontal forms and the use of reinforced concrete as a building material.

The Finnish father of the functional style is the architect Alvar Aalto, who was responsible for Finland's first funky building, the Turun Sanomat office building, in 1930. Although this was a long time ago, the practicality of the functional style has survived in Finland. It refers to the functional design of dwellings and spaces. It means that everyday life is made easier by a functional environment, whether it is a home or office space. Among other things, Finnish functional style is responsible, quality-conscious, purposeful and material-conscious. The building has BREEAM In-Use environmental certification at Very Good level.




The location is one of Tallbergintalo's absolute strengths. It is easily accessible by public transport and car.


Ruoholahti
